**From the desk of the DRE:**

We've passed the celebrations of Saint Patrick's Day and Saint Joseph's Day, and we have the Annunciation coming up this week, so, even here in Lent, there is much to celebrate!

This Sunday, we have the third Scrutiny reading from the Gospel of John: the raising of Lazarus from the dead. During the Scrutinies, we are meant to read each of the readings—the Woman at the Well (John 4), the Man Born Blind (John 9), and the Raising of Lazarus (John 11)—“against” ourselves: we are to let the Scriptures scrutinize us and reveal to us where we are especially in need of God and his provision in our lives.

Jesus came to give life, and to give it in abundance (John 10:10). Save for his own glorious Resurrection from the dead, the times when Jesus restored the dead to life speak most poignantly about his mission—and his power to make it happen! The question is: Though we may not be physically dead, what are the things in our lives that need new life? An attitude? A grudge? A habitual sin? A stubborn will? A broken relationship? Something else? Maybe these things have come about through our own poor choices, or maybe they have been wrought upon us by someone else. In any case, how might Jesus want to bring new life into such a situation in your life?

The first step for all of us is, like both Mary and Martha, Lazarus' sisters, to acknowledge that those areas *are dead*. Too often, I think we resign ourselves to accepting that “that's just the way it is” or worse: “That's just how I am.” We choose to stay in the grave.

Jesus is in the business of *transformation*. Of *transfiguration*. Of taking our broken, fallen lives and making of them something absolutely overflowing with life—life that fills you up and spills over into those around you.

Paradoxically, the way Jesus brings new life is through death—his death and ours. We realize Jesus' new life in our own lives precisely through *dying* to those things which bring death. We crucify all of our fallen nature, nailing it to the cross. Every time we do that...every time we die to ourselves, if we listen closely, we can hear Jesus tearfully calling from just outside our self-made tomb: “Lazarus, come out!”
