

From the desk of the DRE.

Sobering. That's the best word I can think of to describe this Sunday's Gospel reading. In it, Jesus is asked a question: "Lord, will only a few people be saved?" I would have hoped he would answer, "No, no... many—in fact, *most*—people will be saved."

But that's <u>not</u> his response. Instead, he says: "Strive to enter through the narrow gate, for many, I tell you, will attempt to enter but will not be strong enough..." I think many people have adopted the attitude so popular these days that most—if not all—people will go to heaven. But that's hard to reconcile with Jesus' words, "And you will say, 'We ate and drank in your company and you taught in our streets.' Then he will say to you, 'I do not know where you are from. Depart from me, all you evildoers!"

What does Jesus mean? I think, in a modern context, he means that just believing that God *exists* is not enough. (Consider James 2:19: "Even the demons believe that and tremble.") Just *saying you're Catholic* is not enough. Even *regularly attending Mass* and *receiving the sacraments* is not enough. Though all of these things are *important*, one can do all these things and still be faced with Jesus saying, "I do not know where you are from."

The Scriptures and the teaching of the Church are clear: what Jesus desires from every individual is a life of intimate personal relationship with him and a living out of the faith one professes. In other words, we need to make friendship with Jesus and faith in God our <u>top</u> <u>priority</u> in life. As radical as it sounds, all other things—including recreational activities, sports, job/school, making money, even friends and family—need to come <u>after</u> our commitment to God. It's not that these other things are unimportant, but they all are <u>rightly ordered</u> <u>only</u> in a life that puts God first. Without compromise.

That's not the way many of us think. It's not popular. But listen to the words of Saint Anselm of Canterbury: "If you would be quite sure of your salvation, strive to be among the fewest of the few. Do not follow the majority of mankind, but follow those who renounce the world and never relax their efforts day or night so that they may attain everlasting blessedness."

Let's encourage one another to live just such a life. That's how, in 2025, in the tiny rural communities of Thorp and Owen-Withee, a generation of saints is formed!
