Of the 800 bags of powdered milk sent to Lima in each shipment, 194 go to Casa Hogar, 200 to the 17 orphanages in the Lurin area, 200 to the Diocese of Lurin, 150 to Sagrada Familia Orphanage with its 500 children, and 40 to

Santa Rosa, a community devastated by flooding in 2023. This leaves six bags for emergency use. As you can see, it's not just Casa Hogar that benefits from this milk... it's the whole region around Lima, Peru, and they all thank you very much! 

### From the desk of the DRE

It's a liturgy of contrasts. On this weekend of Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion, we begin the Mass waving our palm leaves, singing Hosanna, and joining together in welcoming the Son of David into the Holy City. But by the Passion reading, we are calling for the crucifixion of the King of the Jews. It is truly a liturgy of contrasts, and so often, this contrast seems to echo in the ways we approach the Lord in our everyday lives.

What were the crowds shouting as Jesus rode into Jerusalem? Hosanna! – a word that simultaneously conveys praise and adulation and calls on the Lord's help and deliverance. And to whom were they calling it? To the Son of David—he whose throne the Lord had promised to establish forever. In and of themselves, these shouts and appeals are not wrong or even misguided. They are spot-on in recognizing the significance of the long-awaited Messiah entering into the Holy City. But a few days later, the crowds are now appealing to those same Roman authorities they had imagined that the Messiah came to cast out appealing to them that they put to death this same Jesus, the so-called King of the Jews.

What could cause allegiances to change so very quickly? There are obviously many factors at play: power struggles, financial payoffs, religious and political corruption—but I suggest something happened that we are as guilty of as the first-century Israelite in Jerusalem: our perception that God failed to deliver in the way I was expecting. Isn't that like us? We become so wed to our expectations that we become steadfastly unwilling to accept any turn of events, any deviation from that which we expect. We are not merely buckled into the driver's seat of our lives, we are melded to it. So much so, that we cannot comprehend, much less accept, when we steer left and the car goes right, that someone else just might be driving.

Job famously said, "We accept good things from God; should we not accept evil?" I think the challenge before us all as we enter into Holy Week is to take a look at the evil circumstances we face in our personal lives, in our parishes, in our nation, and in our world, and trustingly submit to them as the will of God for us. This does not mean that we cooperate with evil, nor that we do not work against evil, but while they persist, the invitation is that we trust that our loving Heavenly Father is working out and providing for us, as St. Paul writes, "an eternal weight of glory beyond all comparison" precisely through these evil circumstances. This is the invitation of the redemptive work of the cross.

When it comes down to it, the choice is yours: in your disappointment, your pain, your suffering, will you join your voice with the crowd who cries, "Crucify!," or will you trust that the hand of God is at work, even in your trouble, and take up your cross?
