



From the desk of the DRE

Well, it's still about a week until the summer solstice, when summer officially begins, but I'm just betting your summer is well underway. Kids are out of school, gardens are planted and growing, and if you have a lawn, you're mowing it.

That's the thing about summer in Wisconsin—life is all around you. Life, specifically plant life, is what Jesus focuses on to help explain the kingdom of God in our Gospel lesson this Sunday. In it, he tells two parables: the first is about how plant life springs up and grows, though we know not how, and the second is the parable of the mustard seed.

Now, let me pause here and ask a question: do you ever feel like it's hopeless? Like you're spinning your wheels? Like all of your efforts at trying to live in accordance with God's will are coming to naught? Like there is very little fruit being borne in your life? I know I feel that way at times. It just seems like the tide of secularism is so vast and pervasive that there are few, if any, notable times when the kingdom of God is breaking in. Pray and strive as I might, it seems like it's two steps forward, then about seven or eight back. If you've experienced this too, then this Sunday's Gospel is for you.

In the parables Jesus tells, we find reason to take heart: the kingdom of God will not be deterred. It is, he says, as if a man were to scatter seed on the land and would sleep and rise night and day and through it all the seed would sprout and grow, he knows not how. Of its own accord the land yields fruit, first the blade, then the ear, then the full grain in the ear. And when the grain is ripe, he wields the sickle at once, for the harvest has come."

Or again, Jesus says, the kingdom is like "a mustard seed that, when it is sown in the ground, is the smallest of all the seeds on the earth. But once it is sown, it springs up and becomes the largest of plants and puts forth large branches, so that the birds of the sky can dwell in its shade."

What I hear in both of these kingdom parables is Jesus saying, "I got this." In other words, whenever it seems like you're struggling to have a kingdom impact on the world around you, but you see precious little in terms of effect, it's time to trust. Jesus is inviting you and me to trust: to trust that he is the one who causes seed to grow, to trust that he takes even the tiniest of offerings and expands it, multiplies it. In short, to trust him. Jesus, I trust in you.
