Eucharistic Revival-week of June 30, 2024-Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time A Minute with Jesus: The Eucharist is called the Lord's Supper. On the night before He was crucified, Jesus had a meal with His Apostles in the Upper Room. It was at this "Last Supper" before He died that He instituted the Holy Eucharist. This was Jesus' way of remaining with us throughout all time. During supper, Jesus changed the bread and wine into His Body and Blood, saying "This is My Body which is given for you" as He will be crucified the next day. "This cup which is poured out for you is the new covenant in My Blood"

(Luke 22:19b-20). Jesus offered His Body and His Blood on the cross so that we could be adopted into the family of God and live united with Him on earth and forever in Heaven. Let's pray this right now and every day this week: Jesus, thank you for always remaining with us in the Holy Eucharist.

From the desk of the DRE

Welcome to Practicing Catholic! Patrick Conley, glad to be with you again. Thanks so much for tuning in to hear about just a few of the manifold ways Our God is at work in our midst right here, in the Archdiocese of Saint Paul and Minneapolis.

In last Sunday's Gospel, we saw Jesus calming the storm and giving a light rebuke to his apostles in the boat with him to have faith in the midst of the violent squall that had blown up around them. Remember? Jesus said to them, "Why are you terrified? Do you not yet have **faith**?"

Faith. The Lord desires faith. He emphasizes faith. In the Gospel for this Sunday, we have a sandwiched pair of stories that again revolve around faith: the healing of the woman subject to hemorrhaging, and the raising of Jairus' daughter from the dead.

Faith can move mountains: it can raise people from the dead! But the main purpose of faith is not what it can do for us, in terms of miracles and healings and the like. Faith lived <u>unites us to God</u> and <u>brings him glory</u>. St. Irenaeus, whom we celebrated this Friday, June 28th, said, "The glory of God is a human being fully alive." Spiritually speaking, a person is only alive to the extent that they live by faith. Hence, a person "fully alive" is the person who is full of faith, who is faith-full.

So, what is the essence of this faith that the Lord Jesus so desires? Some would describe it as trust. And it is that, to be sure! Think of all the many ways Jairus and the bleeding woman demonstrated their trust in Jesus!

But the essence of faith is also the ability to look at the present moment and see beyond it, into eternity. It is to see and believe in the real reality lying behind the reality we encounter. It is living your life in communion with the priorities of the Gospel, which at

communion with the priorities of the Gospel, which at times, as scandalous as it sounds, means that a dying 12-year-old girl may have to wait while an example is made of a woman's faith.

How could this be? Jesus commendation of the woman and her faith is very public—in the midst of the crowd. When he finally goes to raise Jairus' daughter, he is with only a few of his closest friends. Jesus desires people—Jesus desires you and me to have faith above all, because faith is the glue that binds us to God. Faith both penetrates and transcends the present moment. Faith is spiritual life, and

spiritual life is never deterred by physical death. For all these reasons, amongst even more, Jesus desires faith. He, himself revealed this deep desire when he rhetorically asked, "When the Son of Man comes, will he find faith on earth?" Please, God, let it be so...that when we meet him face-to-face, we may then hear him say, "Well done, good and faithful servant."
